COVID-19 and Contact Tracing Policy for Culver City English Country Dance

In general we follow the policies of the Southern California Community Dance Coalition (SCCDC), our parent organization.

COVID-19 Policy

In order to protect the health and safety of our dance community, attendees of any Culver City English Country Dance (CCECD) event must meet the following requirements before being allowed entrance into an event. Attendees must:

- Be free of key COVID-19 symptoms within the previous 24 hours of the event. <u>Symptoms</u> <u>defined by the Center for Disease Control</u> include:
 - Nasal Congestion or Runny Nose
 - Sore throat
 - Fatigue
 - Headache
 - Cough

- Muscle/Body Ache
- Fever/Chills
- Nausea/Vomiting
- Diarrhea
- Agree to the Contact Tracing Policy by signing the COVID-19 waiver.
- Sign the General Liability Waiver and COVID-19 Waiver available at the registration desk or CulverCityECD.com. These Waivers are retained for the current year.

We recommend:

- Registering in advance for each event using the link to each event's Google form at CulverCityECD.com to expedite registration, waiver-collecting, and contact tracing.
- Optionally wearing masks at the discretion of the participant.
- Updated Covid-19 vaccinations are encouraged, but not required.

Contact Tracing Policy

Anyone who becomes ill with symptoms of COVID-19 and tests positive for COVID-19 within 1 week following a CCECD event must notify the event organizer via text (818.577.7168) or email within 24 hours of receiving a positive Covid-19 test result. The event coordinator will then initiate contact tracing so other participants can be warned of possible exposure to COVID-19. It is highly encouraged for attendees to test if they exhibit COVID-19 symptoms within 2 weeks of a CCECD event.

CCECD event organizers will be responsible for contacting all registered participants within 24 hours of being notified that an attendee has tested positive for Covid-19 using the contact information provided by the participants upon registration or from their signed waiver.

A positive Covid-19 test result from an attendee does not necessarily mean it was contracted at the event, but it does indicate that person may have been infectious, even while asymptomatic. Other participants should be aware of the possibility of exposure so that they can take precautions.
